Principal's Message

I am pleased to report, after 12 months of building work the new roof is finally complete and the scaffolding is gone. Over the past year we have also been refurbishing different areas of the school including new carpet and student desks on the top floor, an outdoor fitness center for students to use during PE classes and at break times, the Student Drop-in has new furniture and Lab 1 in the Science block has also been extended and fully refurbished.

The buildings are in great condition given many are almost 50 years old.

At the start of Term 3 Schoology will be deactivated and all staff and students will be using Google Classrooms as our Learning Management System. With this change we are also updating how we communicate with parents and carers to include a weekly bulletin (replaces the 3 newsletters each term) and a Facebook page (to replace the Schoology Community Page). The changes will align us to other ACT Government Schools and improve the ease and speed parents and carers can access information. There is more detailed information about the changes in this newsletter.

If you have a spare room in your home for one more teenager, consider hosting an international student. The international student learns about Australian culture and family life and practices their English speaking skills while the host family gains a unique understanding of cultural diversity through their homestay student. Families who open their homes to an international student are reimbursed \$300 per week to cover all costs. It's a wonderful experience if you have a spare room in your house.

These unfortunate incidents are a reminder to us all to help our children and young people understand the importance of stranger safety approaches to staff immediately. The placements are available to Yr 10 students only.

Year Nine Career Conversations (CC)

Career conversations with Yr 9 students are aimed to develop a career plan that embarks on documenting the process of finding out what the student wishes to do in the future and how they are going to get there! CC's also assist students with WEX planning. All students will have the opportunity to develop a career plan by mid Term 3.

Vocational Learning Opportunities (VLOs)

Congratulations to Samuel Sing and Jayco Lam-Jefferies who completed the VLO Cafe Essentials and attended the Presentation this week. Both students have gained valuable work knowledge and skills working with the training organisation, CIT. Semester 2 VLO's will be offered again next term and will be advertised later this term.

White Card and Asbestos Training

Students wishing to complete paid work or work experience on a site must complete specialised training in Occupational Health and Safety and working with Asbestos. We will be running this training at the school on 28 and 29 June 2018. The total cost of this training will be \$140. Permission notes will be available in the library and on the Yr 9 and Yr 10 pages shortly.

Schoology to Google Classroom Transition

From next semester we will be switching from our current Learning management system, Schoology, to Google Classroom. Schoology will no longer be used for teaching and learning or for communication via the Mount Stromlo High School Community page. This switch has been necessitated by some changes in our IT systems and to align ourselves with other ACT public schools. Below are some details regarding how these changes will affect students and parents as well as some ways in which we are improving our communication systems.

Parents

Google classroom offers a different method by which parents can engage. You will be able to receive weekly or daily emails which give you a summary of the activity that has occurred in your child's classes and also outlines items that are due and overdue. All parents will have an opportunity to opt in to this system which we will launch in the first week of next term.

We will also be offering two new ways to engage with the school. A weekly emailed bulletin will be sent to all parents and will contain information concerning upcoming events, important dates, and general information. We are also launching a Facebook page to provide a window into all the amazing learning that takes place at our school. These new forms of communication will replace the existing newsletter and the Mount Stromlo High School Community page on Schoology. Both the weekly bulletin and Facebook page will begin in week 1 next term.

Students

We began the transition to Google classroom with students this semester and from next semester they will be using it for all their classes. It integrates very effectively with the students new chromebooks and is a very simple and powerful tool for teachers to deliver learning tasks. Students are all currently members of their respective year group page and next term will receive daily notices through these.
