

# Year 9/10 Woodwork Projects

## Semester 1 Course Outline

The focus of this course is on making woodwork projects of various kinds but principally functional furniture. Students will build upon their knowledge developed in previous courses in this subject area. They will expand their proficiency in using a range of manual and powered equipment. The majority of the students in this group have had at least one semester of woodwork at 9/10 elective level. There will be students at different stages of proficiency in this class. Some are doing elective woodwork for the first time. Projects will be set to meet individual needs accordingly. Successful completion of projects requires the application of effective facilitating skills such as excellent communication, time management and organizational ability. Projects are structured to maximize technical learning while allowing for creative input by the student.
