

Year 9/10 Visual Art 101

Semester 1 Course Outline

In this 'Foundation Arts' unit students have the opportunity to focus on developing their skills and techniques within all Artistic mediums. Students will be introduced to techniques and skills in the areas of Painting & Drawing, Mono & Lino-printing, Sculpture & 3D Artwork, Collage & Montage. By looking at various approaches artists have taken throughout History and exploring these different techniques, students will be equipped to produce self-directed artworks. The development of drawing and observational skills will be an integral part of this course.
