PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Welcome, returning and new families, to another year of learning at Mount Stromlo High School, where we continue as a school community to reach for the stars. The first week of the year has been fantastic and it was wonderful to meet all of the new students that have joined Mt Stromlo HS this year on Tuesday, as well as seeing the smiling faces of returning students on Wednesday. We also welcome a number of new staff this year including; Miss Benedictos (Japanese), Miss Crampton (HaSS), Miss Moala (HaSS), Miss Rapson (HaSS), Mr Angel (PE & HaSS), Mr Lambert (PE), Mr Torrance (Science), Miss Mills (Science), and Miss Thain (TAF). I'm sure they will fit into our culture and will enjoy their time at our school.

The new mobile phone policy is one week in and so far the vast majority of students have responded with maturity and responsibility, either not bringing their phones or having them in their bags and switched off. Phone use at school has reduced significantly, to almost zero, with staff commenting on the reduction in distractions to learning that the policy has brought about. I know that if I have ice cream in the house that I will eat it (when I shouldn't!), therefore I don't have it in the house. The same is true for mobile phones. INTERESTED IN A CAREER IN THE PERFORMING ARTS?

Work Experience at the Canberra Theatre Centre (CTC) is a crucial first step to understand the performing arts industry and how it operates.

Canberra Theatre Centre offers Year 10 & senior school students a chance to spend a week in Canberra's largest professional theatres, learning, developing, observing, and participating in various areas of operation. The Canberra Theatre Centre is the major presenter for performing arts in the ACT. It comprises three theatre spaces, the Canberra Theatre, The Playhouse and The Courtyard Studio.

Students will spend time working out of The Courtyard Studio with a small group of passionate theatre makers, while learning from industry professionals across all areas of theatre, including directing, stage management, lighting, sound, mechanics, performance, design and more. Participants will also be given the opportunity to directly pursue their passion in theatre or stagecraft and design, direct or produce a pre-selected scene throughout the week.

Students will gain valuable feedback from industry professionals on the strengths and weaknesses of their own work and suggestions and adjustments to improve their processes in theatre production.

The CTC Work Experience Program will run during the following weeks in 2024:

- April 15 19, 2024
- June 24 28, 2024
- December 2 6, 2024

SELECTION CRITERIA

You need to fit the following criteria:

- Be in Year 10 or above or a tertiary student (if work experience is a mandatory requirement to complete the relevant course)
- Demonstrate an interest in the performing arts.
- Be available to do work experience at an allocated time.

To apply for a placement please students must complete all sections and submit the <u>Work Experience Application Form</u>. Interviews are conducted to select appropriate candidates.
