### PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

As a school community we are constantly looking to review our performance in all things that we do. One of the ways we review is through our annual satisfaction surveys that are completed by staff, students and families. These surveys are only of use if we get significant numbers or responses therefore, I urge all parents to please complete the 5–10-minute survey. The survey was sent via email on 18 August (and closes 8 September) and the results help us determine how well we are meeting the needs of our community.

Another way we review our performance is through a formal External Review process using ACER (Australian College for Educational Research) and the NSIT (National School Improvement Tool). For 4 days this week we will be hosting a panel of 2 ACT principals and a Lead Reviewer from ACER to interview staff, students and parents. The affirmations, commendations and recommendations that this panel will feed back is based on NSIT's 9 domains that describe a highly effective school. This is a very exciting time for us as we have the opportunity to have three educational experts review our performance. Their feedback will form the basis of our next 5-year School Improvement Plan and help us to continue to achieve our purpose of: Together, Reaching for the Stars.
