PRINCIPALS ADDRESS

This week marks the beginning of a partnership with Cate Challen from Queensland University of Technology. Cate is working with our staff to help us with our practices and processes that enable continuous improvement for our students. Cate will be talking with staff and observing classes this week, then working more closely with our classroom teacher leaders over the next 9 months. She will provide feedback and help us to embed continuous improvement practices across the school. Cate's help enables us to achieve our School Purpose as *Together, Reaching for the Stars* is all about the whole community continuously improving.

Continuous improvement is also relevant when looking at NAPLAN results, which were mailed home this week. Whilst the limitations of NAPLAN are well known, it is a source of information for us as a school, but is also of interest to students and their families. The NAPLAN report gives a lot of information on what the student did well at and what areas could be worked on, based on how they performed on a specific test on a specific day. It is a conversation starter, it is not a complete representation of what a student can or can't do and therefore any information should be considered along with information from their teacher. If you have any concerns about your child's NAPLAN result in a certain area then please speak to your child's teacher in that area to get a more complete picture.

COURSES FOR YEAR 9 AND 10 STUDENTS

First Aid Course

Stromlo High has secured a trainer from Canberra First Aid to run the course at Mount Stromlo High School. They have limited places on offer so it will be those who return their permission notes and pay, who will secure their places first. The course is delivered in two parts. The first is an online component which needs to be completed before the course date. This section will be started during school hours two weeks before the training day but will need to be finished at home. Then students will then engage in a full day of practical training and assessment.


Career Starter Program: Game Programming
