

# Year 9/10 Film Making

## Semester 1 Course Outline

Film Making teaches the art of video and film production. Students further develop their film literacy and repertoire by exploring and researching various film styles and genres. They will have the opportunity to gain hands-on experience by scripting; shooting and producing a short film (including a location shoot). Students will develop skills in using digital video/SLR cameras, industry-standard editing programs, audio and lighting equipment. Whether you want to enter a film festival or just want to refine your YouTube clips you will learn useful skills in this course. There will be a strong emphasis on teamwork throughout the production phase of this course.
